The Fraser music therapy team created **Musical Journeys** to focus on building social and communication skills for children in a group setting. Music therapy is a fun, motivating and interactive way to achieve a wide variety of goals. Each group session is divided into eight essential parts: sensory time, hello song, instrument games, dancing and movement, language skills, social communication games, relaxation time, and goodbye song.

Musical Journeys is offered through **Fraser Rehabilitation Services**, which provide comprehensive evaluation, consultation and treatment services for children with motor and sensory dysfunction, decreased functional and developmental skills, feeding and swallowing difficulties, and speech, language, and hearing disorders. These therapy services are provided with an interdisciplinary approach and each child's goals and activities are individualized, based on strengths, challenges and motivations. Fraser therapists collaborate with parents, caregivers, teachers and mental health practitioners to maximize results.

Program Highlights

- Musical Journeys is designed to nurture children's development of social and communication skills among peers. Each session includes musical experiences with instruments, dancing, songs and sensory equipment.
- Groups are available during after-school hours.

Ages Served

Musical Journeys groups are scheduled based on the child's age:

- Ages 3 to around 6*
- Ages 7 to around 11*

*additional information is considered to assign the most appropriate group

- Fraser music therapists have a bachelor's degree in music therapy from an accredited college or university.
- A required 1040 hours of applied experience are completed during their music therapy internships.
- Music therapists are required to pass proficiencies in piano, guitar and voice.
